(Maximum 500 words): Management information system is a system formed and developed by the institution for updating, co-ordinating, analysing and controlling various information in the organization. College has Partially Management Information System.

Being an autonomous institution, the college has its own examination department. In Govt. Holkar Science College the IT cell of the examination department manages and uploads news and information from time to time on the college website. The IT cell has created student's profile where all the details of the students seeking admission in the college are readily available. The students can see their results, fill the examination form, can print out their admit cards etc. online. In addition to this the IT cell also update the details given to it by various Departments like information regarding workshops, seminars and conferences etc. organized and also those which will be organized in future. The IT cell displays and uploads all the official notices on the website. In a nutshell the objective of MIS is to share notices, results, admission process, ongoing activities etc. with the students, faculty members and all those who want to seek information about the college.

The college has a well-defined administrative set up for the smooth functioning of the institution. The administrative procedure and fee structure are given in the college brochure and they are also displayed on the college website- <u>www.collegeholkar.org</u>. This information can also be sought directly from the college inquiry office. While the principal as the head of the institution remains at the helm of all the academic and administrative affairs in the college, the administrative officer serving as a link between the principal and the other staff members facilitates day to day administration of the institution. Every teaching department is headed by a senior professor entrusted with the administrative and academic responsibilities of that particular department. There are formed various committees comprising senior and experienced members of the staff for a number of activities taking place on the campus through the year. Constant monitoring is done to avoid any slackness in the administration.

Admission to the college is based on merit basis and is done online through a central agency appointed by the Dept. of Higher Education Govt. of MP.

The student's record is maintained in the office of the principal as well as in the exam department. The statistics related to the students is also uploaded on the college website. This information is updated on the portal of AISHE also.

*Every teaching department of the college has been equipped with internet/Wi-Fi in order to facilitate research activities. The college website is regularly updated.* 

The students passing out from the college have to fill a feedback form. It helps to trace the

location and to keep the data of the students as they give their details related to the college they have taken admission or sought jobs at various companies.

Mentors act as a link between the students and the institution and perform following functions:

- Sign Identity cards of the students and conform admission of students in the beginning of the session.
- Meet the students regularly.
- Continuously monitor, counsel, guide and motivate the students in all academic matters.
- Advice students regarding choice of electives, projects, summer training in industries etc.
- Contact parents/ guardians occasionally.
- Advice students in their career development.

The college has a fully automated main library with approximate 92 thousand text and reference books. The departments have their separate departmental libraries also.

The regular monitoring and maintenance of these academic facilities is undertaken by the respective departments through dedicated AMCs and all up-gradation and repair works is done by the department internally. In addition, PWD undertakes periodic survey of the various infrastructures on the campus and takes proactive steps to ensure high standards of maintenance.

The sports facilities on the campus are actively managed by the Sports department, which is headed by two sports officer and their supportive staff. The computers and the networking on the campus are maintained through dedicated AMCs. Computer department and IT cell is also responsible for the maintenance of entire digital physical infrastructure in the campus.

College gardens are maintained by gardeners under the supervision of Garden Committee and Botany department. The college has deputed watchmen and a third Party Security Agency that works under the supervision of the college administration. They are in charge of the security for the institution.

Annual stock checking of furniture, lab equipment, ICT facilities is done internally by the departments. The department makes committee to write off the equipments, books etc. The report is submitted to the administration by the head of department. There are sweepers and a outsourced housekeeping team to look after the cleanliness and hygiene in the college.

## **Response:**

Holkar Science College, Indore is one of the most prestigious institution in central India. It is an autonomous institute since 1989. The College practices both decentralization and participative management at three levels i.e. at Academic level, Administrative level and by the Examination Department.

Academic Activities: For academic activities, the departments are given sufficient autonomy. The principal appoints head of the departments under the decentralized policy. The HOD's along with the faculty members take various decisions for the smooth functioning of the department. The committees, various cells etc are formed by the administration that looks after the various schemes, admission process, finance, career counselling for the students etc. The entire college is involved and participates for the betterment of the institution.

Administrative Activities: At administrative level also, the college practices decentralization and participative management. The budget allotted by State Govt./UGC/ Janbhagidari Samiti is distributed to various departments according to their requirements. The heads of teaching departments are responsible for the utilizing the sanctioned amount as per state Govt. rules and instructions given by the administration and purchase committee. Further, beyond those levels, the financial decisions are taken at College administrative level by principal and the A/O. #### 6.2 Strategy Development and Deployment

6.2.1 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following (with in 100 words each):

## Curriculum Development:

College follows the syllabi designed by Central Board of Studies under the Department of Higher Education. The College has its own board of studies in each department. Departmental Board of Studies of the college approves the syllabi proposed by the Department of Higher Education. The College has the autonomy of 10% enhancement in the proposed syllabi at UG level for their respective courses for maintaining the standards of instruction. Framing of Guidelines for examination and valuation is conducted by the examination department. At PG level Credit based choice system has been implemented with open elective papers. This approach aims to empower learners to shape their education through choices. Each year the syllabi are revived/revised accordingly in the presence of the subject experts. It involves planning, identifying, modifying and evaluating the content according to the learner. The reviews are done on the basis of practical requirements and industry needs. The developed curriculum is adapted in relevance with Regional/National/Global development needs. The contents of the syllabus is oriented toward generating employability, entrepreneurship and skill development. The curriculum design teaches students how to look at a problem and formulate a solution. Considered an authentic form of learning because students are exposed to real-life issues, this model helps students develop skills that are transferable to the real world. Problem-centered curriculum design has been shown to increase the relevance of the curriculum and encourages creativity, innovation and collaboration in the classroom.

## Teaching and Learning

The college continuously improves its infrastructure and incorporates new technology, tools and aids, to improve the teaching and learning processes. Classrooms and all laboratories are equipped with projectors. Wi-Fi is available across the college campus. Browsing centre is available for students to access internet and it helps students to prepare their presentations. Teaching is supplemented with workshops, educational tours, laboratory visits, and field trips. For effective teaching and learning, teachers adapt techniques like - power point presentations, smart board, posters etc. Expert lectures, seminars and workshops were conducted in the college to enhance learning. To improve teaching different types of teaching methods have been adopted by teachers as: Telling method(Lecture method, storytelling method, discussion method etc), Activity method (Project method, problems solving method, etc.), Visual Method (Textbook method, demonstration method, etc.), Mental method, Tutorial Method, Questions-Answer method, Discussion method etc. Remedial classes are organized for

#### slow-learners.

## **\*** Examination and Evaluation

The rules and regulations concerning the evaluation process, distribution of marks of internal assessment are framed by the examination department. Each department maintains the record of syllabi covered every month and ensures that the tests, assignment, presentations etc are conducted. Moreover the departments ensure the Internal Assessment monitoring, record of attendance, sending the marks of assignments, tests and projects to examination department. For UG courses, 2 assignments are mandatory followed by one final exam in each semester. For PG students, 2 CCE Assignments and viva-voce are mandatory followed by one final exam in each semester. To maintain transparency in evaluation system, the students were given a privilege to view their answer books of CCE. The college follows semester system at UG and PG levels. From the year 2017 college adopted annual system at UG level. The CCE of the students is ensured through test, assignments, seminars etc. and there is a written examination at the end of the semester. In order to maintain confidentiality and academic standards it mandatory that at least 50% of the exam papers are set by the external setters. The college follows a centralized pattern of valuation at UG level and PG level valuation is done by the setter. Examination results are made available on college website; student can download the provisional mark list. The various steps are taken to evaluate of answer books- Mixing, coding, valuation, scrutiny, review, decoding, data-entry, results on website. Mandatory moderation of question paper before the commencement of examination. Provision to show valued answer sheets on the request of the students in the presence of the subject experts and guardian to satisfy the students by removing their doubts. Here students can challenge the valuation. Revaluation done by two examiners. Examiner for M.Sc. practical exams and for M.Phil. Viva voce are from outside the native university.

#### **\*** Research and Development

The college has a College Research Cell. This cell provides guidance to faculty about funding agencies promotes interdisciplinary research and monitors progress of research activities, motivates faculties to publish research papers in peer reviewed journals with high global impact factor for quality research, motivates to submit the Major/ Minor research projects to funding agency. Motivates faculties to attend seminars and workshops and presenting research papers. College has registered as research centre in six subjects. College has facilities for research work. Rresearch labs have emerged as specialized areas involve new research ideas and promote research culture. It encourages the students to undertake the research in the new fields. New high tech instruments like FTIR, IR etc. are available in labs. Every teaching departments of the college has been equipped with internet in order to facilitate research activities. Latest research journals are available in the departments and in the library. For e-journals and e-books del-net is installed in library. The college follows two types of research:

1. Basic Research: This type of research system is followed at PG level on the basis of small project and assignments.

2. Applied Research: This type of research is mainly followed in PG and Post PG research where students focus mainly on more specific and directed objectives and investigations.

## Library, ICT and Physical Infrastructure / Instrumentation

The library is fully automated and has 63149 text books and 28890 reference books all bar coded, 07 books have been added in 2018-19, 3791 Journals, 350 CDs, 660 Thesis, 65121 digital database. 25 computers. Del-Net, INFLIBNET, e-journal facility is available in the library. Library is fully automated by SOUL 2.0 ILMS software. Some PG departments have separate departmental libraries e.g. Biochemistry, Microbiology, Pharmaceutical chemistry, Horticulture and Seed Tech. etc. Facility of LCD projector for effective audio-visual teaching learning, ICT technology is used as effective teaching tool, IT lab and instrumentation rooms available for students. 51 classrooms(02 new classrooms have been constructed during the session), 44 laboratory, 05 seminar halls, one auditorium (Yashwant hall), Indoor and Outdoor sports facilities, one boys Hostel is available in the college. New constructions are also in progress.

## Human Resource Management

The college has a well-defined administrative set up for the smooth functioning of the institution. While the Principal as the head of the institution remains at the helm of all the academic and administrative affairs in the college, the administrative officer serving as a link between the principal and the other staff members facilitates day to day administration of the institution. Every teaching department is headed by a senior professor entrusted with the administrative and academic responsibilities of that particular department. The recruitment of the permanent employees is done by the Department of Higher Education Govt. of M.P.. The salary and other benefits related to finance, leaves, health etc. are regulated and implemented as per the rules laid down by the department of higher education. The recruitment of higher education. Confidential performance appraisals are regularly filled, Personal files well maintained. The college has computerized account keeping and administrative system. Students are prepared for interviews by arranging lectures of various eminent personalities working in various sectors. They make students aware about the scope and environment of the companies. Department of pharmaceutical chemistry has collaborated with PG Tech research institute (PGTRI) and certificate courses are organized yearly with collaboration with this institute during the session. During the session 2018 - 19 department of Biochemistry singed MOU with Noble Alchem Pvt. Ltd. (Agribooster), Sanwer Road, Indore, M.P., Tuteja's Forensic Examination and Research Centre, Indore. During the session 2018-19, department of Biotechnology and Bioinformatics has visited Aasha confectionary Indore. Collaborative support for internship and field training from different government, public sector and private organization such as GSI, ONGC, MOIL, HCL, Rajami Geo-Exploration and SS enterprises. Placement Cell of College provides the students with exposure to resume writing, soft skill training and employment opportunities. Companies are invited to conduct interviews, offer internships and hold talks and discussions.
